

All the Fruit Salad trees are very practical and unique trees for the small backyard because they are multi-grafted to produce a variety of different fruits, all on the one tree! This eliminates the "glut" that is familiar with a single variety tree. Each graft grows independently from the others on the tree and the different fruits will always retain their own characteristics eg. flavour, appearance, ripening time and will continue to produce for many years.

A comprehensive Care Leaflet with each Fruit Salad Tree explains planting, watering, fertilising, pruning, pests and more on pot growing.

Caring for your tree when it's young and developing will result in a well balanced mature tree, requiring minimum maintenance.

Grow In Ground OR In Pot

Best to grow trees in ground so they reach maximum height and yield of fruits. The trees can also be grown in a pot. If growing in a pot, the size of the tree and therefore the quantity of fruits, will be determined by the size of the pot.

General Notes about Fruit Salad Trees

- Trees can be ordered, and planted throughout the year. The potted trees are despatched by Mail Order.
- The grafts are attached as low as possible to minimise the height of the tree and make the fruit more accessible.
- First fruits can appear as early as the first spring after planting, however it's best for the tree to remove these and allow the framework of branching to develop first.
- Trees prefer all day sun and require minimum of half day.

TWO SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR CARE OF MULTI-GRAFTS

Maintain Balanced Growth of Grafts

Establish a well 'balanced' tree by pruning back the more vigorous growing grafts, any time and regularly during the growing season. Thin out branching of each graft, if needed, to equalize growth vigour! Otherwise the more vigorous growers will become bigger and bigger, and dominate, at the expense of the slower growers.

Hint: Keep each graft confined to grow in its own area around the tree, this will assist in recognizing faster and slower growers.

Remove Rootstock Growth

Any new shoots emerging from the main central stem of the tree or from ground level, must be removed. This is growth of the rootstock tree.

Hint: Identify the different grafts, growing from the main central stem (e.g. put a dab of paint), these are the anchor points of each graft. Check and remove all other growth from the central stem (rootstock).

Stone Fruit Tree

Peaches, (white and yellow flesh),
Nectarines (white and yellow flesh),
Plums (Blood and Yellow flesh),
Apricots, Peachcots



Each tree combines between 2 and 8 of the above listed fruits

- Each variety will ripen at a different time and so extend the harvest.
- **Climate Conditions:**
Varieties to suit warm, cool and cold climates (Apricot not for tropical areas)
- **In Ground Height:** About 3 metres (9 ft) High and 2.5 metres (7ft) Wide
Can also be grown by espalier method
- **In Pot Height:**
Depending on pot size, e.g. in half a wine barrell, tree may grow to half ground size.

Multi-Apples

Green, Yellow & 2 types of Red skin apples
Each tree combines 2, 3 or 4 of the above listed fruits



- The varieties will cross pollinate and provide an assortment of flavours and colours, with different ripening times
- **Climate Conditions:** Varieties suit tropical, warm, cool and cold climates
- **In Ground Height:** Up to 2 metres (6 ft) High and 2 metres (6 ft) Wide (dwarfing) *Recommend to espalier (growing along wires horizontally or fan shape, to support the heavy crop)
- **In Pot Height:** Depending on pot size, e.g. in half a wine barrell, tree may grow to half ground size.

Citrus Fruit Tree

Oranges winter and summer,
Mandarin, Lemon, Lime, Tangelo,
Pomelo and Grapefruit

Each tree combines between 2 and 8 of the above listed fruits

- Each variety will ripen at a different time and so extend the harvest, even all year round!
- **Climate Conditions:**
Warm, Cool & Cold and can withstand -8°C temperatures
- **In Ground Height:**
2 metres (6ft) High and 2 metres (6ft) Wide (dwarfing)
- **In Pot Height:**
Depending on pot size, e.g. in half a wine barrell, tree may grow to half ground size.



Multi-Nashis

Japanese Pears

Each tree combines 2, 3 or 4 varieties.

- Delicious fruit with pear-like thin skin, very juicy, crisp and crunchy like an apple.
- The varieties will cross pollinate and provide an assortment of flavours and colours, with different ripening times.
- **In Ground Height:** 3 - 4 metres (9 - 12 ft) High and 2 metres (6 ft) Wide

*Recommend to espalier (growing along wires horizontally or fan shape, to support the heavy crop)

* Recommend to grow in the ground
